Disk Drives and Junior

If you haven't replaced the disk drive in your Junior yet, it is AT LEAST 16 years old! As it and the cooling fan are the only moving parts in the PCjr, many of our drives are living on borrowed time.

Our Juniors use a 5.25" 360K disk drive. It is next to impossible to find a new replacement drive should you need to replace your old one. Our only alternative is to purchase a used drive.

Most thrift stores and even some computer repair shops have some pretty good drives available. The disk drives in the IBM PCs and clones are usually interchangeable with the disk drives in the PCjr.

Still, you need to take some close looks at the replacement drive. Electronically, the drives may be identical, but you must make sure they will fit physically. Here are some pointers to keep in mind.

Make sure the latch on the front of the drive will clear the opening in front of Junior. The drive is recessed, so the latch must clear the case. You may have to modify your Junior to make it fit!

Take a look inside your Junior. Note that the flat ribbon connector attaches to the drive on the right rear of the drive. Note how the cooling fan attaches to the left side of the drive housing, so the connector must be on the right. Your replacement drive must have the ribbon connector in the same location as the original drive. Normally, the small power connector isn't any problem, but make sure.

Before you replace your drive, clean it with one of the disk drive cleaning kits. You need to rule out the chance that you may have just a dirty drive.

If you can't find a replacement disk drive locally, PCjr Club members can purchase one from the Club Store. Other sources are PC Enterprises (1-800-922-PCjr) or Computer Reset (214 276-8072). Or, check the Internet.

Preserve Your Power Supply

Your PCjr power supply will give you longer service if you disconnect it when it's not in use. IBM recommends unplugging your PCjr from the wall outlet when you finish using your computer. Unplugging eliminates the chance of an electrical surge caused by lightning or power fluctuations damaging your cherished PCjr. Even lightning strikes nearby can cause destructive surges. Disconnecting is also said to prolong the life of the power supply.

We highly suggest using a high quality surge protector! Plug all of your computing components (monitor, printer, modem, etc.) into it and simply turn off the surge protector's switch when you leave your computer. An added benefit to using the surge protector's switch is that you save wear and tear on the switches of all your computing components.

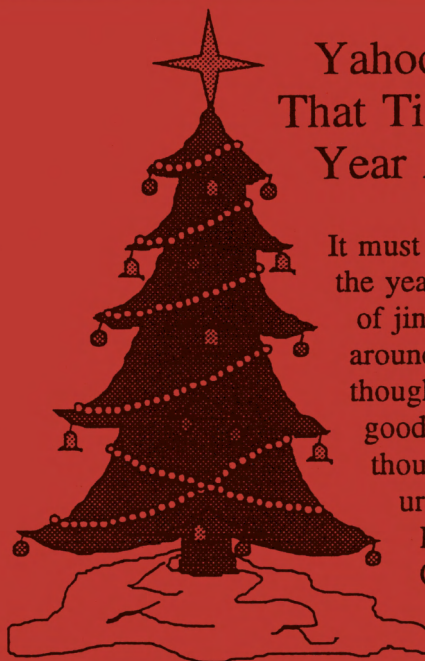
A "power strip" with a series of outlets on it is not necessarily a protection against electrical surges. Be sure to get one that is specifically labeled "surge protector."

As our Juniors get older and replacement parts become more scarce, it is important that we try to protect all of Junior's components. The power supply does have fuse protection, but it is VERY difficult to replace the fuse as it is in the molded case of the transformer.

If you need to replace any of Junior's parts, your Club should be the first place to look. Check the Store catalog or e-mail Phil at rp_janz@efn.org. As with any purchase, you should check around for the best price--I know where that will be!!

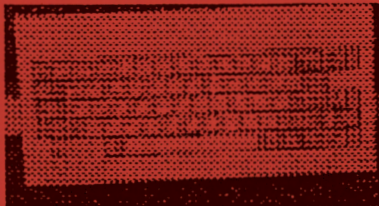
PCjr Music Machine -

Using the PCjr is a neat way to teach the kids to write their own music! The PCjr Music Machine program will display notes and tones as you write the music using your Junior's keyboard. Play it back in three voice harmony. Even adjust the key, tempo, note values, etc. Works well with 128K. Disk E-107 in the Club Library.



Junior's Special Keys

Ever wonder how to turn on the keyboard "clicking" sound?



Remember how to run Junior's Internal Diagnostics? Here are those things you forgot to remember!

Keyboard Click: press Alt-Ctrl-Caps Lock keys. This will allow Junior's keyboard to make that clicking noise as you type.

Internal Diagnostics: press Alt-Ctrl-Insert keys. This will start Junior's ROM based diagnostics program.

Keyboard Adventure: Press the ESC key right after the BASIC screen comes up. This will begin the "Keyboard Adventure" game. Make sure that there are no disks in the drive and that Cartridge BASIC is NOT installed in Junior.

Screen Centering: Ctrl-Alt-left arrow key or right arrow key. This will center the text on Junior's screen.

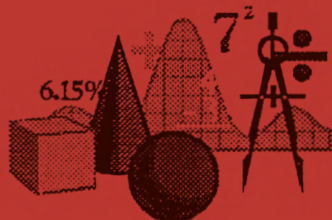
THE CLUB STORE CHRISTMAS SALE!
